Mr. Albert Allen Shaw, 67, of Elsberry, Missouri passed away Friday, September 6, 2013 at the St. Joseph West Hospital in Lake St. Louis, Missouri. Funeral services will be held at 2:00 p.m. Friday, September 13, 2013 at the Collier Funeral Home in Louisiana, Missouri. The Rev. Don Amelung assisted by The Rev. Randall Cone will officiate. Visitation will be held from 11:00 a.m. until time of services at 2:00 p.m. Friday, September 13th at the funeral home. Burial will be in the Riverview Cemetery in Louisiana, Missouri.

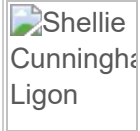
