Cindy L. Maschmeier, 64, of Louisiana, MO, passed away on Saturday, January 1, 2023 at the Mercy Hospital in Washington, MO. Her wishes were to be cremated and a Celebration of Life service will be held at 2:00 P.M. on Saturday, January 14, 2023 at the Collier Funeral Home in Louisiana, MO. Cindy was a mother to all and turned no kid or friend away at her doorstep. Seen as a second mother to many people, she loved hard and would give her last penny to somebody if they needed it. She always gave 100% of herself if it meant making someone's life better. She and her husband Robbie gave open invitations to their "Scrabble Nights" to everyone. Coming to scrabble night meant good drinks, memorable laughs, and even better records on the record player.
