Elbert "Junior" Travis VanHooser, Jr, age 86 of Louisiana, MO, passed away Friday morning October 18, 2024 at his home.

Cremation rites are under the direction of Collier Funeral Homes, Inc in Louisiana, MO. A celebration of life will be held at a later date.

Junior was born November 29, 1937 in Louisiana, MO, the son of Elbert Travis VanHooser, Sr. and Hazel Pauline Davis VanHooser. He was raised in Louisiana, attended school and graduated from Louisiana High School with the class of 1956. While going to school, he worked at Stark Brothers Nursery. Following high school, he enlisted in the United States Army and was honorable discharged two years later. Following his military career, he returned to Louisiana and worked at Hercules for a couple of years. Junior attended x-ray school to become an x-ray technician and worked for Pike County Memorial Hospital for many years. After retiring from PCMH, Junior then went to work for the Louisiana R-II School District as a janitor for 6 years.

Junior was united in marriage to Bobbie Sharon Page April 28, 1961 at her family's home in Louisiana. She survives. Other survivors include his two sons Scott VanHooser (Debi) of Bowling Green, and Mike VanHooser (Tricia Shepherd) of Louisiana; grandchildren Sarah, Heather, Jamie, and Travis VanHooser of Bowling Green, Emma Altgilbers of Louisiana, Kaitlyn Brown

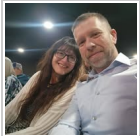
