Mr. Collier passed away Thursday, October 25, 2012 at the Maple Grove Lodge Nursing Home in Louisiana with his family by his side. He was born August 22, 1913 in Avalon, Missouri, the son of Dr. Alfred Klein Collier and Jennie Louise Neill Collier.

He was united in marriage December 11, 1933 to Bernice Brown in Trenton, Missouri and she preceded him in death October 9, 1993.
