He was born July 23, 1916 in Fond Du Lac, Wisconsin to John P. McCoy and Teresa Brennan McCoy. ?? He married Cleo Healy January 12, 1946 in Fond Du Lac, Wisconsin and she preceded him in death in April of 1972. ?? He is survived by five sons; Patrick J. McCoy and wife, Kate of St. Peters, MO, Timothy J. McCoy and wife, Barb of St. Ann, MO, Michael J. McCoy of St. Ann, MO, Thomas J. McCoy and wife, Kathy of St. Ann, MO and Matthew J. McCoy and wife, Renee of Bend, Oregon. Four daughters; Maureen Row and husband, Don of Cassville, MO, Kathleen McCoy of Cassville, MO, Colleen McCoy and husband, John Walter of San Francisco, California and Patricia Nourai of St. Louis, MO., 19 Grandchildren, 7 Great-Grandchildren, Two sisters; Gertrude Little of the State of South Carolina and Frances Duritsa of Minneapolis, Minnesota. ?? He was preceded in death by a daughter, Theresa Gaulke and a grandson; Mark Baron. ?? He graduated from High School in Fond Du Lac, Wisconsin and attended the University of Wisconsin at Oshkosh, Wisconsin. ?? He was a veteran serving with the United States Army Air Corp during World War II. He

enlisted in Nov. 1941 and graduated from the Officer's Candidate School in Ft. Warren, Wyoming in June, 1942. He served in the South Pacific Theatre which included, New Caledonia, Banika of the Solomon Island Group, New Guenia and Palawan Philippines, where he served as Commanding Officer of a Quartermaster Co. Aviation. He was discharged in 1946 with the Rank of Major. ?? He began his career with J C Penny Department Stores in 1937. Rejoining J C Penney's in 1952 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He had managed stores in Hannibal, MO., Burlington, Iowa, the River Roads Shopping Center in St. Louis, MO., and in 1971 was transferred to Tucson, Arizona until he retired in 1976. He later accepted an offer from the International Executive Service Corps to organize and set up a department store in Manila, Philippines which was owned by the Chinese. He managed this store for six years and also opened two additional stores during this time. ?? He had served as Chairman of the Community Chest Campaign and First Vice President of the Burlington Chamber of Commerce. President of the River Roads Shopping Center Association in St. Louis, MO. and President of the Tucson Trade Bureau as well as President of the Tucson Youth Hockey Association. ?? He was a member of the St. Joseph Catholic Church in Louisiana. A member of Elks Lodge 791 in Louisiana and a member of the 13th Air Force Association. ??
