Jack was born July 1, 1932 in Peoria, Illinois to Quentin A. Sencenbaugh and Mildred Chaney Sencenbaugh. Jack exchanged vows with Peggie A. Benard in Louisiana, Missouri on November 9, 1957 and she survives. Jack was a long time business owner of P&S Electric Co. of Louisiana that he started with Jerry Pellikaan in 1968. The Company is continuing on with his two sons, Kenny

and Jeff. He was a veteran serving with the United States Navy during the Korean Conflict. Jack became a member of the Louisiana Elks Lodge 791 on October 24, 1963 being proposed by Gene D. Robinson. He also served on the Trimble House Committee from 1982 to 1998. He was a 32nd degree Mason and member of Perseverance Lodge 92 AF&AM in Louisiana being initiated on February 17, 1970 and raised on September 12, 1970. On March 27, 1976 he joined the Scottish Rite and was a member of the NEMO Scottish Rites Club and a member of the Shriners. He was a member of Nightingale Chapter 117 in Louisiana. In 1986 he joined the American Legion Post 370 in Louisiana. Jack was a member of the Centenary United Methodist Church in Louisiana and enjoyed playing in the Bell Choir. Jack spent all of his time enjoying his family and friends, especially his six grand-children always attending sporting events, dance recitals or whatever they were participating in he was there. He enjoyed his travels around the country throughout his life but his favorite place was taking care of his farm he purchased near Bowling Green, Missouri.
