September 18, 1915 - June 13, 2012

E. Pearl King, 96, of Louisiana, passed away on Wednesday, June 13, 2012 at Lynn's Heritage House. Services were held at Centenary United Methodist Church in Louisiana, MO, with Jeanne Webdell officiating. She was laid to rest at Fairview Cemetery. Pearl was born in Ashburn, MO, September 18, 1915 to Jay McIntyre and Dessie Lee (Houchins) Penrod. They precede her in death. She was raised in the Ashburn Bottoms and lived her entire life in Louisiana, MO. On June 3, 1965 she married Paul D. King of Clarksville, MO. He preceded her in death in 1977.
