She definitely had a personality that wouldn't quit, or back down from nothing and no one, yet always wanted to keep the peace. She was a wonderful spirit, full of love with a huge heart. Life here on earth will never quite be the same without her, but we know earth life is short, but Heaven is for eternity. So, let's not mourn her death, but celebrate



her life and the times we shared together. To Peggy (Eggbert), my cousin, my sister, my mom, my friend, and so much more, you will never be forgotten...until we meet again. You rocked kid!!! Enjoy the new journey. Peace be unto you.
