Mr. Poul Stampe Munck, 88, of Louisiana, Missouri passed away Saturday, January 2, 2016 at his home in Louisiana, Missouri surrounded by his family and friends. His desire was to be cremated. A Celebration of Life service will be held at a later date.

He was born February 25, 1927 in Saeby, Denmark the son of Ejnar S. Munck and Ida Ahlefeldt -Laurigen Munck. He married Mary Suto October 30, 1965 in Allentown, Pennsylvania.

After retiring from Dundee Cement Company he went back to work with FL Smidth Company as a trouble shooter for another ten years before retiring.

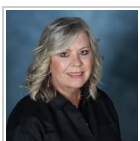

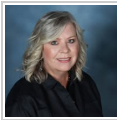
